HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY INFORMATION

Automobile Insurance

Florida law requires that all automobile operators have insurance.

Before you register a vehicle with at least four wheels in Florida, you must show proof of Personal Injury Protection (PIP) and Property Damage Liability (PDL) automobile insurance. PIP covers 80 percent of all necessary and reasonable medical expenses up to \$10,000 resulting from a covered injury, no matter who caused the crash. PDL coverage pays for damage to another person's property caused by you or someone else driving your insured vehicle.

Proof of PIP/PDL coverage must be issued by an insurance company licensed in Florida to sell policies or by qualifying for a self-insurance certificate issued by FLHSMV.

Automobile Tags


Within 10 days of moving to Florida, you must obtain a Florida license plate if you are employed here, your children attend school in the state, you claim a homestead exemption or you register to vote.

To get your license plate, you must take your vehicle registration, proof of insurance and automobile title to any tag office.

Homestead Exemption

The state offers a Homestead Exemption to Florida residents who own and occupy a home as of January 1sat of any given year. The exemption is \$50,000 off the assessed valuation of your home. Military with 10% or more VA Disability \$5,000 additional for a total of \$55,000. You must file for the exemption with the County Property Appraiser between January 1st and March 1st for the first time. Then, it will renew automatically on an annual basis. The county will send the renewal by mail. No action is required on your part to renew. Homeowners 65 and older additional exemptions apply call number below for qualification information.

Manatee Big Bend Power Station in Apollo Beach delivered reliable electricity to the community for 16 years before the commercial operation of Big Bend Unit 4 in 1986. That year, people started seeing manatees in large numbers in the power station's discharge canal, where saltwater – taken from Tampa Bay to cool Unit 4 – flowed, clean and warm, back to the bay. When Tampa Bay reached 68 degrees or colder, the mammals would seek out this new refuge. The Manatee Viewing Center was soon born. Today, Big Bend's discharge canal is a state and federally designated manatee sanctuary that provides critical protection from the cold for these unique, gentle animals.

Alderman's Ford

The 160-acre park, located on the Alafia River, offers varied plant communities, river cypress swamps, hardwood hammocks and high sand hills that provide terrain not often seen in Hillsborough County. The park's major attraction is the natural spring, which provides for excellent swimming since the water temperature remains at 72 degrees year round.
